Free Tax Service

Need help filing your income taxes? The AARP Tax Aide Program was designed to provide free assistance for low to middle-income taxpayers, with special attention to those age 60 and older. Volunteer counselors, trained in cooperation with the IRS, will be available every Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday starting February 2 through April 15 (8:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m.). Be prepared to bring copies of your 2007 tax returns, W-2 forms for 2008, Social Security benefit statement for 2008, pension statements, 1099 forms, social security card for those that are filing, a picture ID, real estate taxes paid in 2008, and any forms received in the mail from the IRS. If you are filing for Homestead credit, bring your 2008 property tax bill (whether paid or not), OR a completed, signed rental certificate. Appointments are necessary! Call 422-2776 between the hours of 10 AM and 1 PM, Monday through Friday, to schedule your personal tax appointment. Appointments will be determined on a first-call, first-serve basis. As a reminder, although this is a free service, donations are appreciated and would greatly benefit Lowell Center programming.

Hospice Volunteer Training Course Offered

Ministry Home Care-Hospice Services is offering a free, comprehensive training course for individuals who are interested in becoming hospice volunteers. Volunteers are assigned to roles dependant on their individual interests and abilities, as well as availability.

Currently, there is an immediate need for volunteers to provide clerical support in our Wisconsin Rapids, office, including individuals to answer phones for two hours at a time, daytime hours on weekdays.

Volunteering for hospice patient support visits is unique, in that after completing the training, trained volunteers are assigned to visit patients in their homes based on patient and family need. The frequency and duration of these specific assignments varies according to case specifics, usually over a few weeks, with a break in assignment afterwards. This service allows for a great amount of flexibility and tremendous opportunity for personal growth. Some travel is required, so a dependable auto and driver's license are necessary.

Personal training and ongoing support for all volunteer positions is provided. This spring, four sessions are scheduled over a four-week period, consecutive Tuesday afternoons from 12-4 pm starting on February 24, 2009.

We provide presentations about Ministry Hospice Services as well and these presentations can be scheduled with Deb.


