

By Dr. Reed Lessing**

The Old Testament is chock-full of passion themes, from the serpent being crushed in Genesis 3:15 to Isaiah's Fourth Servant Song. Yet this series looks at some of the lesser-known Old Testament passion themes and focuses on them by means of single words. Two tablets of stone, a few vessels of oil, simple markings, a small army, a remote field, a solemn oath--these are some of the strangest people, places and things through which God revealed himself to his people in the Old Testament. These are just a few of the strange places we will find Christ during this year's Lenten Midweek Series. Once again, pastors from our circuit congregations will be leading us in our journey to the cross of Good Friday and the open tomb of Easter. Lent begins on Wednesday, March 9th. Lenten Devotionals

The season of Lent is an important one in the life of the Church. This is the period when Christians come in penitent adoration before their Lord Jesus Christ for the once-and-for-all sacrifice of His life on Calvary for their sins. With the end of Jesus' earthly ministry, comes the intrigue and tragedy that led to His murder: the false accusations, the mock trial, the torture at the hands of Roman soldiers and, finally, the supreme anguish of the cross. Death claimed Him, but it could not defeat Him. Three days later Jesus rose from the grave as the victorious Savior of the universe, our Easter Messiah.

For 2011, Lutheran Hour Ministries is offering ***The Light Shines in the Darkness***, which takes the reader through the Gospel of John. It shows the simple truth that when light shines, darkness disappears. Jesus' battle against the powers of hell, the ignorance of unbelief and mankind's blind, murderous hatred marked His day-to-day mission in this world. It was His death, however, and *more to the point*, His resurrection, that sealed our triumph over sin, death and the father of lies.




