The Re:Vitality - Serving in God's Mission Module

 our Core Planning Team (CPT) made up of the core congregation leadership and Extended
 Planning Team (XPT).
- 2. **Workshop Sessions**: The SGM module consists of nine workshop sessions, each designed to guide us through different aspects of strategic planning:
 - Session 1: Overview of Strategic Planning: This session introduces the SGM approach and provides an overview of the strategic planning process.
 - Session 2: Building Consensus: We will identify the different types of people in our congregation and work on building consensus around our strategic planning efforts.
 - Session 3: God's Provision and God's Mission: This session focuses on taking inventory of the resources God has invested in our congregation and understanding His mission for
 - Session 4: Identifying Core Values: We will categorize our core values as active or aspirational and discuss how they shape our ministry.

- o **Session 6: The Mission Statement:** We will condense our purpose statement into a concise mission statement that captures our role in God's mission.
- o **Session 7: Vision Statements:** This session focuses on creating vision statements that describe what our mission looks like in action.
- Session 8: SWOT Analysis: We will assess our vision statements using SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Threats) analysis to identify strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats.
- o **Session 9: Creating SMART Goals:** This final session involves developing specific, measurable, achievable, realistic, and timely (SMART) goals for our vision statements.
- 3. **Post-Workshop Implementation**: After completing the workshop sessions, we will implement our Strategic Ministry Plan through a cycle of acting, assessing, and adjusting. This ensures continuous improvement and alignment with our mission and vision.
