What is your (our) purpose?

Twenty years ago, when I first started the Seminary, there was a book that seemed to be everywhere in the Church and in the culture, Rick Warren's *A Purpose Driven Live*. The author, a Baptist pastor of one of the largest churches in America, was on Oprah and many other daytime and night time talk shows. While the book itself teaches several serious false doctrines, it did bring the question "What on earth am I here for" to the forefront, and that was a very good thing.

The question of purpose is a very important one for us to consider in our lives. There is the "What" question but also the "Why." When we consider both of these questions, especially in light of holy scripture, we will find great insight, freedom, and peace that is in Christ Jesus.

The Bible gives us our purpose directly, we are to trust in God and love our neighbor (Matthew 22:37-39). This is the summary of the law. The question of purpose also gives us a perspective with a goal in mind, our eternal goal: which is to worship the Lord. This is because when Christ returns and raises us from the dead, worship will remain. All the other things that we do in our life are secondary.

With this perspective, we now see that all that we do is ordered so that we and other believers would worship the Lord. We evangelize those who do not believe in Jesus so that they may worship the Lord. We love and serve our neighbor in our vocations and in acts of charity in order that they may worship the Lord. We raise our children so that they may worship the Lord.

Why? We love because God first loved us (1 John 4:19).

We are going to spend some time flushing this out in our Bible study, "Serving in God's Mission," **starting November 10** after the Sunday Service. We will look at what this means to live with a purpose individually as God's people and together as a congregation. Again, this Bible study will also lay the foundation for our Strategic Planning as we then turn to the "How?" How do we as a congregation Serve in God's Mission?
